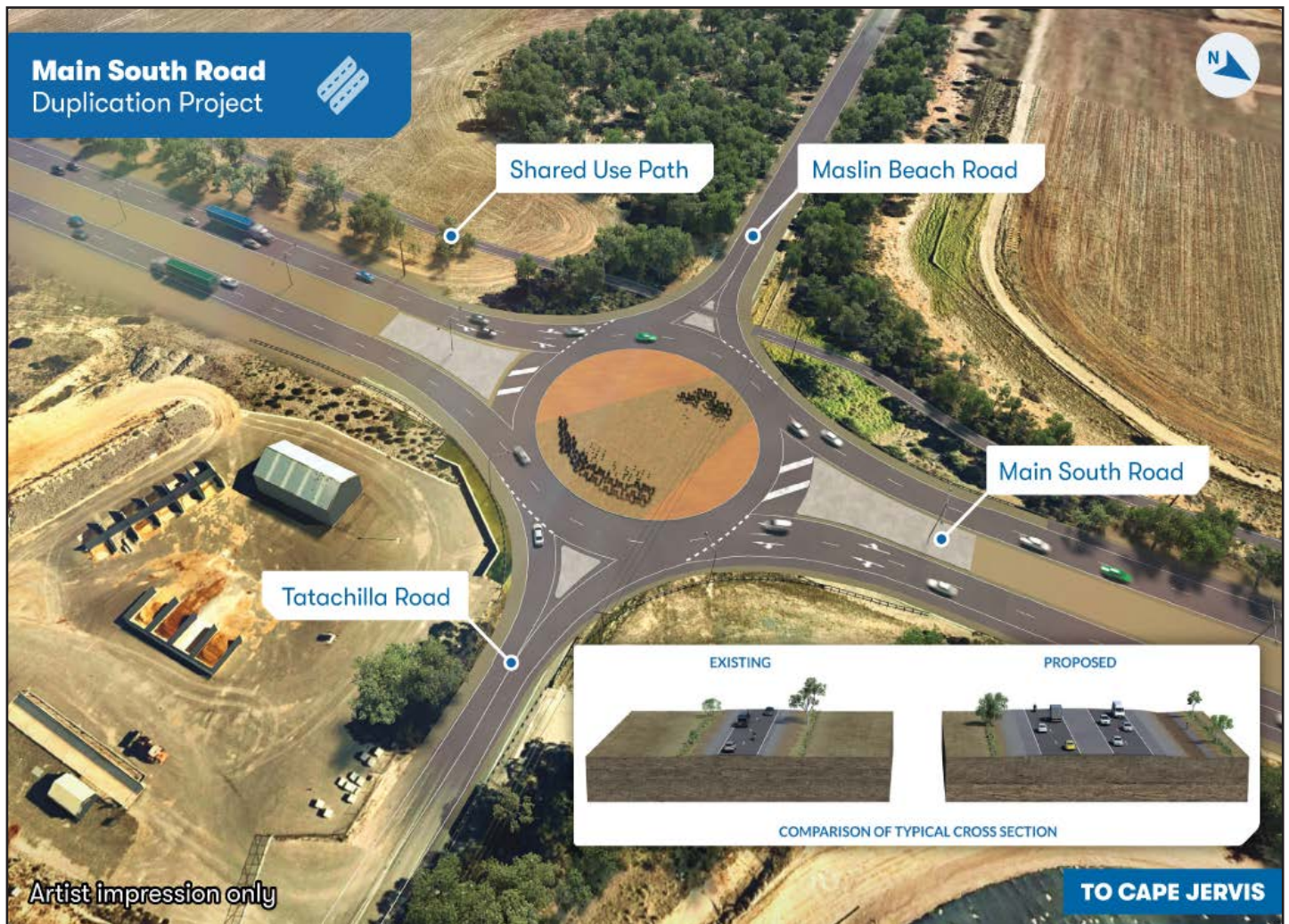

Local Government Update

Council approves McLaren Vale Upgrade

The City of Onkaparinga has progressed with a plan to spend \$310,000 on the Main Street Plan for McLaren Vale after 69% of consultation respondents indicating they either 'loved' or 'liked' the proposal.

The plan will see upgraded lighting and irrigation as well as the installation of a "major art piece".

A report from the council identified that the expenditure in 2021/2022 will be funded out of an Economic Development Reserve and existing Operations budgets and that future works will be part of the Capital Works process.

While the report noted that Main Road, McLaren Vale is a State-owned road, the project had been designed to "minimise(d) the actions requiring the support and approval of the Department of Transport"

The plan has been referred to as a "five-year action plan" with additional funding required each year culminating in \$155,000 in the final financial year (2024/2025).

Council Survey shows gap in Rates and Debt knowledge in community

Councillors received a report in March which showed the gap in knowledge within the community on the budgeting process within the council as well as how the rate-setting process and debt management is handled on behalf of ratepayers.

Based on the survey, 62% of respondents felt they knew "little or nothing" about how council rates are calculated and 79% reported knowing "little or nothing" about council debt.

The report recognised that council financial documents such as the Annual Business Plan has a high degree of complexity but that as council programs and services "do not change significantly from year to year" the degree of the potential community impact of each budget is low.

The council will now spend \$30,000 on community engagement on the 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan to aid both informing and consulting with the community during the May-June 2021 consultation period.

'Place of Courage' to be created in Seaford

After a long campaign from the Spirit of Woman group, the City of Onkaparinga has released a concept plan for a 'Place of Courage' public art project, which will be open for community consultation until April 12th 2021

The artwork is flagged to be installed in the garden at the Seaford Community Centre after being identified by the Council as a suitable location.

Adelaide Artist Clancy Warner has been engaged to design the artwork. The artwork is expected to cost about \$42,000 however, \$15,000 will come from a State Government grant.

The concept is part of a series of public spaces across South Australia and will be a place for reflection, contemplation and healing that provides an enduring symbol for current and future generations of the lifelong traumatic impact of family and domestic violence. State Government Update

Another Roundabout set for Quinliven Road.

The State Government has announced a \$9.4 million roundabout will be built on the intersections Quinliven, How and Bowering Hill Roads, as a result of increased risk as the new Aldinga Payinthe College opens next year.

The project will also see the relocation of the existing koala crossing 80 meters east along Quinliven Road and comes in succession to the recently built roundabout on Quinliven Road as well as pedestrian-activated traffic lights, the first traffic lights installed in Aldinga.

The roundabout will be the fifth roundabout along the Quinliven/Port Road stretch and will be the fourth in the 1.2 km stretch between the Cardijn Galilee School intersection and Main South Road.

The Education Minister, John Gardner MP said “Families will equally welcome these critical safety upgrades that will greatly support managing the increased traffic flow in the area and help keep students safe.”

The roundabout which will create 45 jobs during the project is set to be completed before the new school opens.

Myponga Reservoir now open to kayakers

Two years after opening up the Myponga Reservoir to the public, the State Government has opened up on-water access to kayakers.

Since the Reservoir was first opened for public access in April 2019 it is reported that 75,000 visitors have visited, providing a boost to the local community.

It is expected that other Reservoirs will also have increased public access in the coming months.

Ambos dispute continues as ramping crisis deepens

The Ambulance Employees Association (AEA) has continued to pursue its dispute against the South Australian Government in the Employment Tribunal.

In late March the Government offered an additional 50 Ambulance Officers would be funded on the condition that all Industrial Action (including not charging patients for Ambulance Call Outs) be dropped. The AEA has rejected the conditions attached to the offer and plans to hold a rally with the support of other unions on the 1st of April.

The AEA claims that the Government is withholding a report which demonstrates a deepening ramping and under-resourcing crisis.

Petrol Pricing Data goes live

Attorney-General Vickie Chapman MP has welcomed the launch of Petrol Pricing data in South Australia which allows third-party applications to access real-time information on petrol prices at service stations across the state.

Service stations have a 30-minute window to update prices or face fines from \$550 to \$10,000. A data validation service will also be launched to ensure that the data provided is accurate.

Federal Government Update

MP's call on Tax Relief for Locally Distillers

Federal MP for Mayo, Rebekha Sharkie recently teamed up with Independent MP Andrew Wilkie calling on the Federal Government to provide tax relief to the 300 locally owned distilleries in Australia.

The motion specifically called on the Federal Government to:

- (a) cut the spirits excise rate to the brandy rate;
- (b) freeze spirits and brandy CPI indexation for three years; and
- (c) provide much needed relief to local craft distillers by increasing the current excise refund scheme limit from \$100,000 to \$350,000 for two years, bringing it into line with the rebate offered to small wine producers under the wine equalisation tax.

The industry currently contributes around 5,000 jobs in Australia and indirectly supports further 15,000 jobs. The industry has also received praise for its swift action in producing hand sanitizers during the peak of the COVID-19 outbreak in Australia last year.

Debate on the motion was adjourned to be resumed at a later date.

Rebekha Sharkie calls out Vaccine Price Gouging

Federal MP for Mayo Rebekha Sharkie has called out price gouging from GP clinics charging up to \$90 "vaccine suitability assessments" for new patients booking in at a vaccine clinic.

Those who had reported being charged this amount included Pensioners, which the MP has described as "outrageous" as well as against the requirements for clinics providing the vaccinations.

The Federal Health Minister has stated that the vaccines are free and voluntary and that any associated consultations associated with taking the vaccine must be bulk-billed.

Vaccinations against COVID-19 are available from some local GP clinics for those who are in Phase 1a or 1b. In recent weeks there have been reports of appointments queues spanning a number of weeks.

Ms Sharkie acknowledged that this "appear(s) to be an outlier and that most GP's are adhering to the rules"

Domino Cuckoo Bee

The Domino Cuckoo Bee follows a female bee back to her burrow and lays a single egg on or near the host's pollen ball. The Cuckoo Bee larvae then destroy the host's egg. The burrow entrance is shut by the host bee which means the Cuckoo Bee doesn't have to dig a burrow or collect pollen. She just goes back to drinking nectar and enjoying the sun-shine!

If we picture the Aldinga Scrub some 150 years ago when Europeans first arrived, the present area stood much as it does now with tall Red Gums (*Eucalyptus camaldulensis*) in the top north-east corner standing in winter in up to 1 metre of water and with a shallow lagoon stretching almost half a kilometre northward. Along the eastern boundary was a swamp which developed to the south of the scrub into a large lagoon known as Blue Lagoon.

The Aldinga Scrub owes its present existence to its boggy nature which made it unsuitable for farming, and to the foresight of the Willunga Council. By 1968 the need to preserve native flora and fauna for its own

value was becoming recognised and the conservation movement was gaining momentum.

The Willunga Council resolved not to allow further subdivision of the Aldinga scrub and between 1969 and 1982 about 277 hectares were purchased. In November 1985 the area was gazetted as the 'Aldinga Scrub Conservation Park'. In 1991, an additional parcel of land on the northern boundary was purchased which brings the current area of the Park to approximately 300 hectares.

In 1987, the Friends of Aldinga Scrub was formed by a group of concerned community members to protect the Scrub and to lobby on its behalf. The Friends activities include working bees, propagation, tree planting, educational programs for schools, and monitoring the impact of development adjacent to the Scrub.

Main South Road Duplication Update

After years of fighting for the full Duplication of Main South Road from Seaford to Sellicks, the State Transport Department has released concept designs.

The designs include two 'scenarios' one which has the full duplication to Sellicks with roundabouts while the other duplicates Main South Road to Aldinga (not Sellicks) with an overpass at the intersection with Tatchilla and Maslin Beach Roads.

Importantly both options include a duplication of Victor Harbor Road to McLaren Vale (option 1 goes to Main Road, with option 2 ending at Tatchilla Road)

The inclusion of Victor Harbor Road in the project has caused a mixed reaction in the community with former Mayor Lorraine Rosenberg (and new Vice President of ABRA) describing the move as "robbing Peter to pay Paul". Lorraine has also urged for the communities to speak up and attend the ABRA Public meeting and to provide feedback to the Department that the community does not support either scenario.

Main South Road Action Group (MSRAG) who have been calling out for overpass options at all major intersections have been vocally criticising the move stating that the Government is down-playing traffic volume numbers on Main South Road and that the State Government has "stolen our money!"

Questions remain as to why money originally promised for Main South Road is now being spent on a combined project and why money provided by the Federal Government for duplication of the Aldinga to Sellicks stretch is being used for other stretches under one of the scenarios.

As a strong supporter of MSRAG, ABRA is calling on readers to support the suggestions to not support either scenario in the mailed-out survey residents would have received and instead provide a comment at the bottom of the survey that the community wants (as expressed in a widely circulated petition) the full duplication and intersection upgrades of Main South Road.

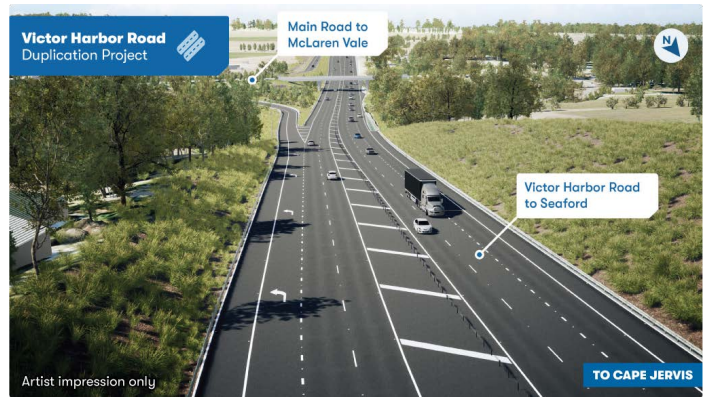

Two cottages in Old Main South Road, Aldinga

These two cottages lie within the Historic Character Area of Aldinga (part of section 400) and are important contributory elements to that character. They are typical of the small residences constructed in the 1860s to 1880s and display simple symmetrical fronted design that was typical of residential buildings, both in the city and in the country areas, during this period. They are constructed of sandstone with brick quoins and door and window dressings. One cottage has had the dressings rendered over to provide a more formal finish. Both cottages retain unpainted stone. It is interesting to note that one cottage has had its elevation sheltered with a verandah while the other remains without a verandah. Both have been re-roofed, but the chimneys are intact and original.

In one cottage (number 11) James Alexander Nelson, a carpenter, and his wife Mary Ann Alice (née Coleman) together with their rapidly growing family lived for more than twenty years from early 1888 until 1911 and ten of their eleven children were born in Aldinga between 1889 and 1909. The family had moved to Aldinga before July of 1888 when James was involved in the rescue of the survivors of the Star of Greece shipwreck. In 1889 he was appointed as the Minister's Warden at St. Ann's Anglican Church, Aldinga and he was re-elected in 1890. James Alexander Nelson nominated for, and was elected as, an auditor for the elections for the Aldinga District Council on at least 3 occasions in June 1895, June 1898 and again in June 1908. The Nelson family moved to Goodwood in 1911.

The allotment that is now 13 Old Main South Road was purchased by blacksmith George Bradley Cox in April 1885. George had been born in Aldinga on 1 Nov 1860, he had married Elizabeth Hart on 5 May 1883 and they had 7 children. They moved from Aldinga to Victoria in 1888. This move was possibly related to the economic depression of the period and George died in 1892, aged just 31 years, in Beulah, Victoria. In 1887 the property was sold to John Noah Crisp, who would later lease and then purchase the blacksmiths shop on the corner of Old Coach Road and Old Main South Road. John Noah Crisp held the property until his death in 1939 after which it passed to his son Wilton Ray Crisp and then to his grandson Glen Raymond Crisp in 1951.

Willunga Environment Centre Update

Environment Centre Funding At Risk

The Willunga Environment Centre, along with seven other Environment and Natural Resource Centres of the Hills and Fleurieu and Northern and York Landscape Boards, have been asked to submit applications to the Minister for the Environment, the Hon. David Spiers M.P., for the continuation of core funding for the 21/22 Financial Year, through a submission to the Landscape Priorities Fund.

This funding is essential to the continuing operation of the Willunga Environment Centre, as it pays for our rent, occupancy costs and the wages of our part-time Manager Janine Anninos and our YACCA Coordinator.

The Willunga Environment Centre, and all the other Environment and Natural Resource Centres, have a rich history of environmental activism, community action and conservation/natural resources leadership. The Willunga Environment Centre staff and volunteers, in particular, have been some of the most dedicated participants in and active delivery agents of environmental activities in the local area for many years.

Overall, these community operated centres provide an integral resource to communities across South Australia and we are confident that we'll secure the funding we need from the Landscape Priorities Fund to keep our doors open for another twelve months.

We won't be advised until April 15 whether our application has been successful and, rest assured, you'll be the first to know.

Submission on the Aldinga Development Plan

The Willunga Environment Centre (WEC), along with a number of other local community groups and individuals, has made a submission to the State Planning Commission re the future development and subdivision of the parcel of vacant land bounded by Quinliven Road, How Road and Aldinga Beach Road at Aldinga.

It will be a major, master planned development with approximately 1,000 house sites, and as such we feel it essential that it be developed in the most sustainable and environmentally aware manner possible.

As one of the leading environmental agencies in the Willunga Basin, The Willunga Environment Centre has a strong interest in the future development of the parcel of land described in the Aldinga Suburban Neighbourhood Development Plan.

We hope to see the successful tenderer for the project adopt suitable measures that will protect the natural environment, contribute to the sustainability of our region and add to the amenity and well being of its future residents.

These measures might include, but are not limited to:

That town gas not be made mandatory;

That all structures should achieve the highest possible sustainability ratings in terms of insulation, alignment, tree cover, etc.;

That proper provision be made for the management of storm-water run-off and the preservation of existing aquifers;

That generous provision be made for street tree planting, including a target for tree canopy and or vegetation cover

That room be allowed for biodiversity and nature in the open space and linear parks;

That lot sizes be sufficient for adequate vegetation cover;

That the utilisation of solar panels be encouraged and that neighbourhood storage batteries be considered;

That a generous proportion of open space and parkland be incorporated into the development, and finally;

That the successful developer consults with local environmental agencies to achieve the best possible outcomes.

South Australia, and in particular the Fleurieu Peninsula, already have an enviable reputation as leaders in environmental legislation. The Aldinga Suburban Neighbourhood Development Plan offers Renewal SA, and the South Australian Government, the opportunity to once again demonstrate national leadership.

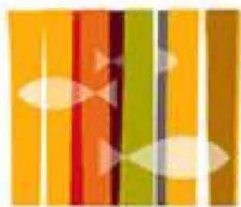

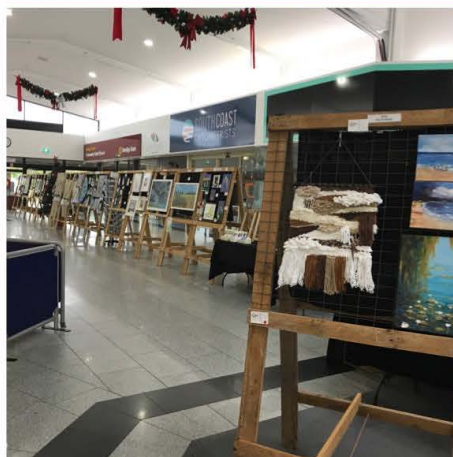
