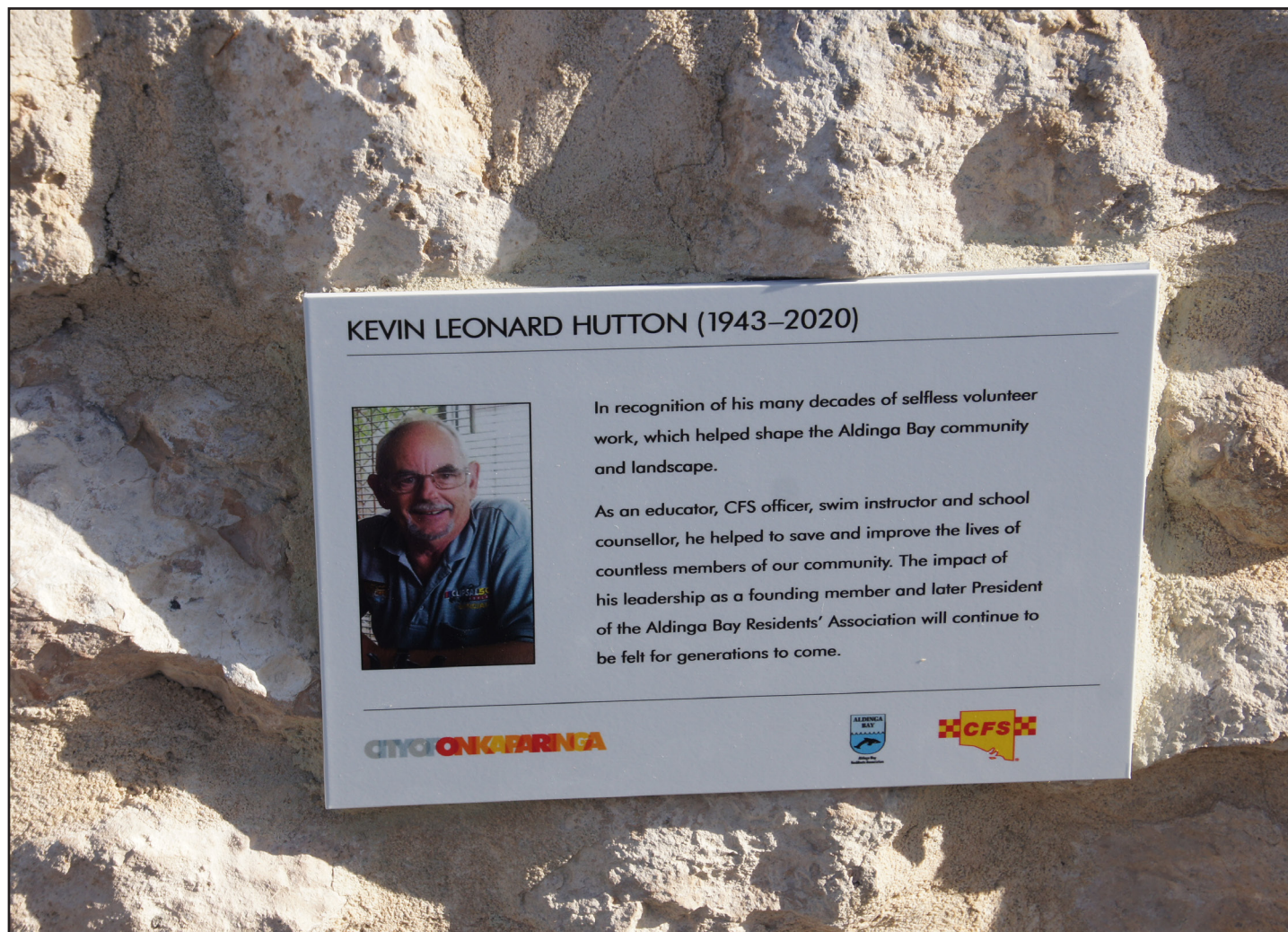

Local Government Update

Council Meeting Disrupted

The June Council Meeting took an unexpected twist when viewers from the public gallery attempted to take over the Council Meeting. The disruption, which was not captured as part of the video recording of the meeting, took place as the Council attempted to move into Confidential Items which by law, must be discussed without members of the public in the chamber.

According to the Council, the recording did not include the attempted breach as “The video cameras are set to automatically capture the speaker on a live microphone, therefore the images recorded when the group entered the chamber are those of the Mayor who had her microphone on.”

Councillor Bill Jamieson, who was approached by the group while outside the chamber handed over documents to the Mayor which the group claims are “affidavits charging the Mayor and CEO with crimes against humanity”. A Council Media representative described the documents as “nonsensical” and “not legal documents” that “do not warrant any response”

The police are aware of the situation and the group involved however “are not considered dangerous”

Coastal Views has contacted each Councillor and the Mayor seeking information regarding any contact they may have had with the group involved. At the time of printing the following Councillors had denied any contact with the group: Cr Heidi Greaves, Cr Marion Themeliotis, Cr Richard Peat, Deputy Mayor Simon McMahon, Cr Michael O’Brien, Cr Geoff Eaton and Cr Suzanne Tonkin. Cr Wayne Olsen was on leave during this period. One response indicated that they believed that another councillor had been in contact with the group, but did not provide details.

Special Council Meeting on Witton Bluff

The council convened a special meeting on the 29th of June to discuss the Witton Bluff Base Trail.

Progress on the Trial was paused after the Council was provided advice from the State Government, sent to Cr de Graaf on 14th January 2021 but was only provided to the Council Administration on the 9th of June. The advice highlighted that Council could face a \$50,000 fine if they breached their obligations under the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1988 (SA).

During the meeting Cr de Graaf apologised for her “personal oversight” in not providing the Council Administration and Elected Members with a copy of the letter. Council staff asserted that upon receipt of the correspondence, they met with the Department and Ministers office urgently to seek clarification of the correspondence.

After her statement, Deputy Mayor Simon McMahon pursued questions directed to the Councillor as to why it took her “...five and half months to share that letter...?” with Cr de Graaf confirming that it was an oversight, Cr McMahon then asked why the full correspondence hasn’t been provided since she became aware of the oversight, despite assurances that it would be provided.

While debating the issue Cr Bill Jamieson highlighted that “people are watching this” and that the area “we’ve got to realise that this is my home, for example, I’ve got an attachment to this area... this is my Country too” while Cr Themeliotis remarked that the last five months has been “very stressful” and that she was “really concerned with the approach by some of the elected members...” with some Elected Members “acting like children”. Cr Greaves concluded the debate by reflecting that process going forward needs to be “a definitive outcome”

State Government Update

Bus Service for New School

The Minister for Education, John Gardner MP, has announced new funding for bus services for students starting at the new Aldinga Payinthe College.

The funding will include new and expanded bus services as well as a dedicated bus leased to the school for the 2021-2024 period. The funding is part of a \$12 million package which will see 20 buses distributed to schools across the state as significant enrolment numbers at impacted school is set to change due to the transition of Year 7 students into High School, and the opening of new schools.

The ongoing funding will be subject to a review as the number of enrolments will increase in the coming years. Aldinga Payinthe College is on track to have 1,675 enrolled students from Birth to Year 12 by the 2026 school year.

The new school is also set to start offering places for the 2022 school year to students in Preschool to Year 6 during Term 3 of this year, with Years 7 and 8 to follow later in the year. It is expected that the school will have approximately 600 students in its first year.

SA Best Slam Timber Crisis Response

SA Best Spokesperson for Agriculture Frank Pangallo MLC has slammed the Primary Industries Minister's response to the states worsening timber crisis.

The state's lack of timber, a key material in the \$16 billion building and construction industry in South Australia was the subject of an emergency summit, called by the Upper House Minor Party to address the ongoing crisis and said that the Minister failed to attend the summit, despite being invited.

Primary Industries Minister, David Basham MP has suggested that the crisis could be eased by the Morgan Sawmill accepting timber sourced from the Bundaleer forest in the state's mid-north. However, Mr Pangallo criticised the Minister for the suggestion: "The Minister has embarrassed himself by making such a suggestion and demonstrates his complete lack of understanding of the state of the crisis and the forestry industry in SA".

The summit also discussed possible solutions to the crisis, including Kangaroo Island operates, however, "Minister Basham needs to get off his backside and urgently secure the \$6 million in freight subsidy required to transport timber off Kangaroo..."

The summit also discussed that according to one participant, the building sector "...is about to enter a Valley of Death situation which will have a catastrophic domino's effect that is expected to be felt across the entire state"

Malinauskas Government would scrap Stadium

State Opposition Leader Peter Malinauskas MP has announced that if elected at the March 2022 State Election, his Government would scrap the controversial new stadium, which is expected to cost \$662 million, promised by the current Liberal Government.

The money, according to Mr Malinauskas would instead be diverted into the Health sector, with \$100 million going to regional South Australia. The announcement came after a poll on Mr Malinauskas page showed 99% of responders supported the money going to Health instead of the planned stadium.

Federal Government Update

Calls for COVID-19 Royal Commission

Independent Senator Rex Patrick has called for the establishment of a Royal Commission to investigate and report on the Australian Government's COVID-19 pandemic response.

“The COVID-19 Pandemic has unquestionably presented Australia with some of the biggest public policy challenges Australia has faced since the end of the Second World War”, Senator Patrick said

“Last year Australia was the envy of many other nations with our success in flattening the curve. However the sad fact is that Australia has now fallen from being a world leader to being hopelessly at the back of the pack in terms of vaccinations.”

“A Royal Commission would have the capacity to summon witnesses and take evidence from Prime Minister Morrison, Health Minister Greg Hunt, other key Ministers as well as senior bureaucrats including the former Chief Medical Officer and now Secretary of the Department of Health, Dr Brendan Murphy.”

“There is clear precedent for a Royal Commissions to deal with highly sensitive matters during a time of national crisis. The Curtin Government convened a Royal Commission to inquiry into highly sensitive matters of national strategy at the height of the Second World War.”

“Australia's national pandemic response is a issue that cries out for investigation by a Royal Commission. Only a Royal Commission can pursue an fully independent investigation, and deliver authoritative findings to serve as a guide for future policy.” Senator Patrick said.

Last Minute Lifeline for Channel 44

South Australia's community television station Channel 44 will remain on-air until 2024 thanks to the advocacy of Federal Politicians. After staring down another June 30 deadline to being switched off, Rebekha Sharkie MP worked with the Federal Government and crossbench colleagues in the Senate to secure free-to-air broadcasting access for the Adelaide channel until 2024.

“I am delighted that Channel 44 will remain on air until 30 June 2024. It was an 11th hour save with the Senate passing my amendment at 11pm last night and it follows weeks of persistent advocacy to the Government. The amendment does set a clear online-only transition deadline for 2024 but this three-year timeframe will allow these two community broadcasters to work through the Media Reform Green Paper process and give the stations sufficient time to really plan their future.” Rebekha said.

Back in 2014, the Government announced that it would remove community television from the ‘sixth channel’ to an online-only delivery model in order to allow a review of the broadcasting spectrum policy framework. A number of last-minute 12-month extensions have been announced since then. Channels in other major cities, including, shut down, saying they couldn't sustain an online-only broadcasting business model.

“Not only are Channel 44 and Channel 31 the training ground for our broadcasting industry, they really proved their value to our community during the COVID-19 lockdowns.” Rebekha said.

“Giving community television a three-year timeframe will allow the stations to work out a business plan and work with their audiences to transition.”

New conservation park to protect the Aldinga Washpool

Liberal Candidate for Mawson, Amy Williams and Minister for Environment David Speirs announced that the State Liberal Government is going to create a new conservation park to protect the Aldinga Washpool.

The Aldinga Washpool which is considered to be a very special place, with significant conservation value as well as being a place of great cultural significance to the Kaurna traditional owners will become part of a larger open space corridor with the precious Aldinga Scrub Conservation Park immediately to the north. Currently, the Washpool is surrounded by parcels of land which are under the care and control of different government organisations, including SA Water and the City of Onkaparinga.


Over many decades, Community Groups including ABRA have been calling on the State Government to bring the entire Washpool under a simpler tenure arrangement to protect all of this land under the National Parks and Wildlife Act, ensuring that its cultural and environmental value is secured.

The Washpool will be proclaimed as a conservation park and the Government has promised that all stakeholders will be brought together to help develop a management plan for the area.

YourSay: Community Engagements

Planning and Local Government Minister, Vickie Chapman has proposed a single website to capture information on how South Australia's 68 Councils spend their money.

The website which has been dubbed "Councils in Focus" is being proposed to provide data to the community that is consistent and useful and has been the subject of a close working relationship between the State Government and the Local Government Association.

The Government has proposed information such as the amount spent on Roads, Waste, the Environment, Community Services and Regulatory services amongst others, will be uploaded and available for comparison based on year on year spend or other councils. Councils may be given the option to provide commentary on the figures provided which could be used when making comparisons.

Minister Chapman has said the move "will help you find out what your council is spending money on, where that money comes from and how it contributes to the wellbeing of your community."

The proposal is the latest attempt by the Liberal Marshall Government to reform Local Government and the Government is now seeking feedback on what details should be included in the new website, which is expected to be launched later this year. Aldinga History

Former Hampshire Hotel at 72 Little Road, Aldinga East

In 1857 Lewis Fidge subdivided part of section 401 (80 acres) into allotments that he called Aldinga village. The Hampshire Hotel, located on lot 6 at the corner of Adey Road (now Paddy's Row) and Little Road, opened in June 1858 and closed in late 1868.

The first licensee was George Adey (1825-1864) and it became known locally as "Adey's Pub". George Adey had relinquished the license by 1863 and then he died, aged 39 years, on 13 July 1864 at Aldinga. There were a series of licensees before the pub closed about five years later in 1868 including: Emanuel Daniels (1863-1865), John Longden (1865-1866), William Thurston (1866-1868), John Cherry (1868-1868) as the assignee of the insolvent William Thurston, and finally Joseph McMurray (1868-late 1868). Arthur Coventry was listed in Council records as the owner in 1867-68. The building then became a private residence and was subsequently owned by the Mumford family (1883-1927) and the Cox family (1927-1938).

In 1937 renowned portrait artist Ivor Thomas Henry Hele (1912-1993) leased the property, then bought and renovated it in 1938 using prize money from two art competitions. It has been reported that a sign with the words 'Hotel Aldinga' was found painted on the wall under the coats of whitewash, during the renovations in 1938. Ivor Hele was appointed an official war artist in both World War II and the Korean War. He added a separate studio in 1957 after he divorced his first wife Millicent Mary "Jean" (née Berry) and married his second wife May Elizabeth ("June") (née Weatherley). Ivor Hele was awarded the Archibald Prize for portraiture on no less than 5 occasions in the 1950s. Three Prime Ministers - Robert Menzies, William McMahon and Malcolm Fraser - all went to his home to have their portraits painted by him and he was knighted in 1982. Sir Ivor Hele died in 1993, aged 81 years, after living for more than 50 years in the former Hampshire Hotel.

The building is on the City of Onkaparinga's local heritage list (#5565)

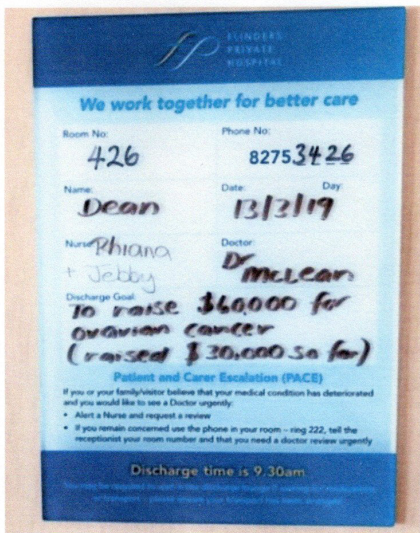
Judith's Legacy

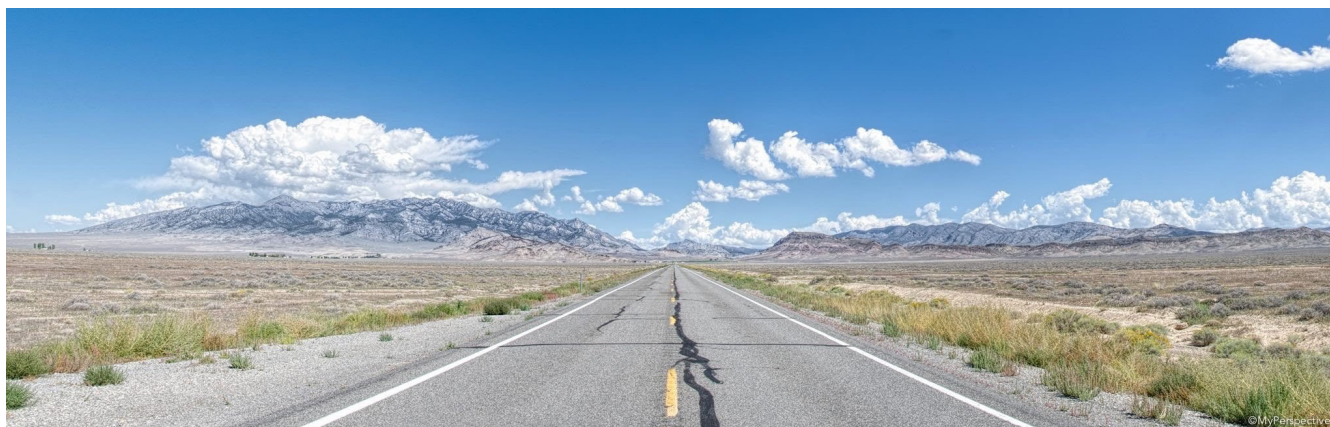

Increasing Road Incidents Cause Concern

Local Police are concerned about the number of road-related incidents that have been occurring in our area in recent months. In June, a road rage incident occurred on Commercial Road Seaford, later the same day, three drivers (including one from Aldinga Beach) were arrested in Aldinga Beach after racing through the streets of McLaren Vale earlier that evening.

Later in the month police charged a woman with drink driving after crashing into two parked cars at Port Willunga, including one that had two children inside. Thankfully both children only received minor injuries and the driver has lost her license for 12 months.

Two separate reports have also been made on social media about irresponsible driving around the Port and Old Coach Road intersection in recent weeks.

Youths arrested over assault of bus driver

Two youths have been arrested for the assault of a bus driver at Morphett Vale. At 7.40pm on Thursday 24 June, a group of five people boarded a bus at Sherriff's Road, Morphett Vale. They were refused travel by the driver as they were consuming alcohol. The bus driver was allegedly spat on and hit in the head with a bottle, receiving a laceration to his head.

A 15-year-old boy from Hackham West was arrested and charged with aggravated assault with biological material, aggravated assault, breach of bail and breach of transit barring order. A 15-year-old girl from Aldinga Beach was also arrested and charged with aggravated assault.

Both teens were bailed to appear at Christies Beach Youth Court on Thursday 26 August and issued with 12 month transit barring orders.
