Last Month the Aldinga Bay Resident's Association (ABRA) hosted a public meeting on the progress of the Aldinga Payinthe College.

Many locals packed into the Aldinga Library (in line with COVID19 restrictions) or braved technical difficulties online to hear from Lee Sansom from Department for Education Lee Sansom, Inaugural Principal- Alison Colbeck and a representative from the Architects.

The speakers took us through the design process, enrollments information and carparking.

Locals also raised various concerns, making the meeting very insightful for all who attended.

Enrollment Information

Enrollments for the 2022 school year will open soon, closing on Friday 2nd of July 2021.

The 2022 limits for each year level will be:

Preschool: 40 children

R-2: 52 per year level

3-6: 30 per year level

7 & 8: 192 per year level

Inclusive Preschool program: 4 children

Supported Learning Centre: 60 students

Pedestrian Lights installed

As part of the increased traffic associated with the new school, a roundabout and pedestrian traffic lights have been installed (the first of any type of 'red-yellow-green' light in Aldinga). Local Government Update

Council adopts Long Term Financial Plan

The Onkaparinga Council outlined its long term financial plan, which includes principles relating to debt, rates and expenditure.

The plan aims to eliminate the Council's deficit within four years while keeping rate increases at the Consumer Price Index (CPI) level.

According to the plan, with the deficit eliminated council long term borrowings (debt) will also be lower than previously predicted.

The plan uses a "more conservative funding formula... to decision making" and still allows for rates to be increased beyond CPI increases provided they inform the community of the need for higher increases and they are directly applied to funding those uses.

Launch of Council 'Transparency Hub'

Readers may recall several of our existing Onkaparinga Councillors being elected on a platform of improved council transparency.

In the latest move to address this issue the council has launched a 'Transparency Hub' on it's website which includes a range of council policies as well as information on released confidential items, corporate expenditure and the (financial and political) interests register of elected members.

According to information found on the hub, as of September 2020 four elected members held membership with political parties and one councillor is employed to work with a federal senator, while three councillors receive some form of income from rental properties.

Councillor Allowances and Reimbursements

The councils regular disclosure of councillor allowances and reimbursements for the second half of 2020 have been released.

The disclosure of this information is required under the *Local Government Act 1999*

Several Councillors (Bray, Eaton McMahon and Themeliotis) did not claim any reimbursements beyond their allowance entitlement for the 6 months from July to December in 2020.

Council also provided a range of equipment to councillors on an ongoing basis, including Software and a Stylus for Cr de Graaf totaling just over \$194.

Cr Brown claimed nearly \$800 for travel and over \$700 for internet usage during this period as well as receiving reams of paper, a printer, tablet, monitor, keyboard, mouse, toner and batteries. These amounts were comparatively lower than South Coast Ward Councillor Richard Peat whose internet claims were considerably lower coming in at \$250 for the same period, despite attending many council meetings via internet during this period.

Over \$450 of travel expenses were claimed by Cr Olsen and Mayor Thompson claimed \$18 for carparking expenses as well as \$50 for flowers for a resident celebrating their 100th birthday.

Between the 12 Councillors and Mayor Thompson over \$204,000 was incurred during the six month period. The full list of expenditure can be found on councils transparency hub.

State Government Update

Leon Bignell to hold Crime and Safety Forum

After a recent spate of criminal activity, local Member of Parliament, Leon Bignell MP has organised a Crime and Safety forum to be held in Aldinga on March 1st 2021.

He has invited the Shadow Minister for Police, Lee Odenwalder MP and Labor Leader, Peter Malinauskas MP.

Leon invited members of the community to attend via a flyer in resident's letterboxes as well as via his social media pages.

COVID-19 Vaccines start to roll out in SA

Saturday the 22nd of February marked the beginning of the roll-out of the COVID-19 vaccination in South Australia.

SA Police Commissioner, Premier Steven Marshall, the Health Minister and the Chief Public Health Officer, Professor Nicola Spurrer were the first South Australian's to receive the vaccination.

The Premier told awaiting media that the vaccine is "safe and free" and that all eligible South Australian adults will have the opportunity to receive the vaccine during 2021. The vaccines are not currently approved in Australia for children.

4,000 doses of the vaccine have already arrived in South Australia with Phase 1A of the roll out program already underway.

SA Health has outlined a roll out plan which prioritizes at risk groups first. The plan can be viewed on the SA Health website.

EPA dumps toxic PFAS plan

During the last week of February speculation began to mount that the South Australian Environment Protection Authority (EPA) was days away from announcing the approval of an application to dump PFAS material at a site on the corner of Tatachilla and Main South Roads.

However, in a surprise move on Thursday 25th of February the EPA announced that it was rejecting the application after "a rigorous assessment process" which highlighted an "unacceptable level of risk."

Local MP, Leon Bignell who led a community campaign against the proposal with the backing of the Onkaparinga Council celebrated the outcome with locals at a McLaren Vale pub. Leon continues to pursue a bill through the South Australian Parliament which would ban applications of this nature within in higher risk areas. While the bill has receive support from minor political parties, it has not received support from the Marshall Government which is crucial for it's passage in the Lower House of Parliament.

Aldinga Bay Resident's Association (ABRA) President Joshua Reiter congratulated the community for it's united stance against the proposal and expressed his support to Leon Bignell MP, the Mayor and Council for getting behind the local community and facilitating a recent meeting of concerned members of the public. ABRA was proud to support the community campaign against the proposal.

Rebekha Sharkie to block Environment Reforms

Federal MP for Mayo, Rebekha Sharkie has announced that she will join other cross-bench politicians in blocking the proposed changes to the *Environment Protection Conservation (EPBC) Act*

In a press release, Ms Sharkie speaking at the Environment Spokesperson for *Centre Alliance* stated that the Parliament: **“...shouldn’t be debating the streamlining approvals legislation until the Government has strong and effective national environmental standards in place and they have created a genuinely independent Environmental Assurance Commissioner”**

According to Ms Sharkie’s press release: **“The Government hasn’t produced a formal, comprehensive response to Professor Samuel’s review and there has been no opportunity for public consultation on the proposed national standards or the design of the position of an independent Environmental Assurance Commissioner.”**

Ms Sharkie’s position is similar to Senators Jacqui Lambie and Rex Patrick.

The *Environment Protection Conservation (EPBC) Act* was first introduced in 1999 but has seen successive amendments over recent years, the changes in question passed the Lower House in September of 2020 where Ms Sharkie voted with Independents Dr Haines and Ms Steggall, as well as the Labor Party.

Ms Steggall, an Independent Member of Parliament representing former Liberal Prime Minister’s electorate of Warringah which is based to the North of Sydney in New South Wales. The amendments by Ms Steggall did not receive the support of the Government and the Bill passed the Lower House unamended by 41-36 votes.

In early October 2020, the Bill then went to the Senate however it has not been put up for debate in that chamber yet.

Aldinga History

former Butcher's Shop on Flour Mill Road

In 1867 Lewis Fidge sold this block of land (part of section 401) to James Waters, a laborer of Aldinga. The land is located at what would later become the corner of Flour Mill Road and Adey Road. Waters sold the land to William Mills, farmer of Willunga, in 1870, then it passed to Mary Ann Moore and finally to Francis Hart, a butcher of Aldinga, in 1882.

Alfred Bird purchased what was probably already an operating butcher's shop on this block of land in Aug 1888 from his stepfather Francis Hart. The property was owned by Alfred Bird from 1888 until his death in 1934 and the building was a butcher's shop for more than 50 years.

Alfred Bird was the son of George Bird (1827-1858) and Mary Elliot (1827-1891) and he was born in Adelaide on 18 May 1857. After George died at the early age of 33 in 1858, his widow Mary remarried to Francis Hart, butcher of Aldinga. Alfred, aged 24 years, married Sarah Ann Cliff, aged 23 years, (1858-1934) on 28 September 1881 at St. Ann's Church in Aldinga. She was the daughter of William Cliff. They had ten children (2 sons and 8 daughters).

Alfred Bird, aged 77 years, died on 9 Dec 1934 at Aldinga and less than a week later on 13 Dec 1934 his wife Sarah Ann, aged 76 years, died. Their sons then sold the business. The former Butcher's shop has been converted to a residence and has very little evidence of its original function remaining. There is a stone barn facing Adey Road that still remains largely intact. It is on the City of Onkaparinga's local heritage list (#20882).

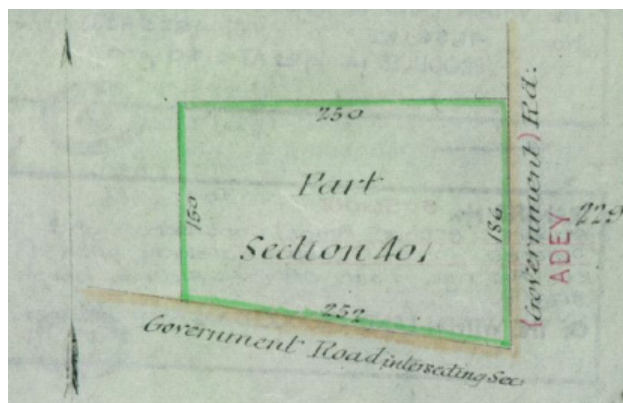


Photo: Plan of the land at the corner of Flour Mill Road and Adey Road from the original Certificate of Title (CT197/32).

Suspect identified in Noarlunga assault

9th of February 2021

Police have now identified the man wanted in connection with the assault on a bus driver last month at the Noarlunga Interchange.

Around 7.30am on Friday 22 January, a man was refused entry on a bus by the driver. Police will allege the man then spat twice at the driver hitting him in the face before throwing an object at the driver's window causing it to crack.

The suspect then left prior to patrols arriving.

An image of the man was released this morning in a bid to identify him.

Following information received from the public, a 21-year-old man from Payneham South was identified and arrested over the incident. He was charged with aggravated assault and property damage. He has been refused police bail to appear in the Adelaide Magistrates Court.

Maslin Beach Bone identified

25th of February 2021

On Tuesday 16 February 2021 a bone was located by a member of the public walking on Maslin Beach, which was handed into police.

This bone has been examined and has been confirmed via DNA to be that of Missing Person - Jesse Corigliano-Quealey, 30 years who went missing from Maslin Beach on 9 October 2020. His death is not considered suspicious at this time.

A second bone was located by police at Maslin Beach on Wednesday 17 February, the outcome is yet to be determined with Forensic Science SA conducting further analysis on the bone.

This matter is being investigated by Southern District CIB who are preparing a report for the State Coroner.

Fatal crash on Malpas Road

25th of February 2021

A woman has died in a crash at McLaren Vale.

Just after 10pm on Wednesday 24 February, police and emergency services were called to the intersection of Main Road and Malpas Road, after reports of a collision involving a Mazda SUV and a Mitsubishi utility.

A passenger in the Mazda, a 19-year-old Banksia Park woman died at the scene.

The driver of the Mazda and three other passengers were taken to hospital for treatment. Their injuries are not considered to be life-threatening.

The three occupants of the Mitsubishi were also taken to hospital for treatment of minor injuries.

Major Crash officers attended the scene to investigate the collision. Roads were closed in the area for most of the night but have since reopened.

The woman's death takes the number of lives lost on South Australian roads to 15, the same amount at this time last year.
