Local Government Update

PM visits Seaford Heights Recycling facility

The Prime Minister, Scott Morrison joined with local Mayors recently at the Seaford Heights Recycling Facility to announce a \$5.35 million injection of federal money into the facility.

The facility, which is jointly owned by Onkaparinga, Marion and Holdfast Bay Councils, processes over 30,000 tonnes of household recycling each year through the Southern Region and is expected to increase to over 60,000 tonnes, thanks to the new funding.



Council creates First Nations People Advisory Group with Kurna Community

The Council has established an Advisory Group between elected members and the Kurna Community to “strengthen and formalise the relationship between the City of Onkaparinga and the Kurna community—the Traditional Owners of Onkaparinga and the wider Adelaide Plains”.

The Group will be chaired by Karl Winda Telfer, Traditional Owner and will meet up to six times each year to provide advice to Council on the delivery of council’s projects and services.

The Kurna Community members who attend the Advisory Group meetings will be remunerated for their attendance at the meeting, at a rate of \$125 per hour and will have four Kurna Traditional Owners as well as Three Elected Members of Council.

The first meeting is expected to take place during June or July 2021.

Council considers value of LGA Membership

After questions over the value of membership of the Local Government Association (LGA) of South Australia were raised at the last council election in 2018, Councillors have sought reports into what the value of benefit to the community is.

At a Council meeting on the 20th of April 2021, Councillors received a report which outlined that the “return to council” from the membership was valued at approximately \$4.5 million from the \$108,608 spent on membership fees.

The report, carried out by “UHY Haines Norton” highlighted that the financial benefits from membership were realised through both savings and contributions.

Councillors were also advised that over the course of 2019-2020, the \$4.5 million of benefit included over \$190,000 in COVID-19 related legal advice, guidance documents and information resources, as well as approximately \$16,000 in savings on training costs.

The Councillors voted on a motion to receive the report, with the initial vote requiring Mayor Erin Thompson to use her casting vote. South Coast Councillors Peat and McMahon joined Councillors de Graaf, Themeliotis and Eaton in opposing the motion.

Opposition claims ambulance funding cuts as ramping crisis continues.

The South Australian Opposition is claiming that the South Australian Liberal Government is the only state to have cut funding for their Ambulance Service based on a Federal Productivity Commission Report.

The Report claims that there is an \$11 million decrease in SA Ambulance Services Government funding from 2019/20 financial year compared to the 2017/18 period. Over the same time Queensland increased its Government Funding by \$190 million.

The claims come as the ramping crisis continues to plague our metropolitan hospital system. Labor has also claimed that the State Government has cut 120 Nursing Positions, 46 Medical Scientists and 4 Doctor positions in recent budgets and that the new Women's and Children's Hospital will have 25 fewer overnight beds than the current hospital.

The Government continues to pursue the South Australian Ambulance Employee Association (Union) through the Employment Tribunal over recent industrial disputes arising from under-resourcing and excluded them from a recent Mental Health Crisis roundtable.

30,000 Year 6 Students set to transition as Year 7 is fully integrated into High Schools

Students currently in Year 6 have been invited to apply for a high school spot in 2022, with all Government High Schools offering Year 7 as part of High School from 2022.

Students in the Aldinga area can now fill in an expression of Interest form to attend the new Aldinga Payinthe College in 2022.

All Year 6 and 7 students currently enrolled in public schools will have received a notification via email or post to advise them that they should be nominating their preferred high school/s for 2022.

Mass COVID-19 Vaccination Hub opens

South Australia's sluggish roll out of the COVID-19 vaccination program has received a much needed boost with the opening of the first of three vaccination hubs, at the Adelaide Showgrounds.

The hubs, which have been set up to primarily set up to deliver the Pfizer vaccine in the wake of the changes to advice to younger Australians getting other vaccinations, are expected to be a welcome and important role in ensuring people have access to the vaccinations and will supplement the existing program which administers vaccinations at some General Practices and Hospitals.

According to the SA Health data, over 155,000 South Australian's had received their first vaccination by the end of April 2021.

It is expected that in the coming months, an additional hub in the North as well as one in Noarlunga will be established to provide the vaccinations to those who are eligible.

The vaccinations hubs come as some states faced increasing restrictions and temporary lock-downs with small numbers of community transmission surfacing as well as high numbers of quarantined cases in South Australia, all from international arrivals.

Federal Government Update

Powering Communities Grant announced

Federal MP for Mayo, Rebekha Sharkie has announced that not-for-profit groups in Mayo will be eligible to apply for a share of \$67,700 in grants to improve the energy efficiency practices and technologies through reducing energy use, improving energy production and reducing carbon emissions.

Some of the eligible activities include investing in energy monitoring, assessments and management systems, upgrading equipment to more efficient models, or investing in on-site renewable energy production and batteries.

Each recipient can receive between \$5,000- \$12,000 for their project and must submit an expression of interest by Friday 18th of June to be considered.

Labor holds Aged Care Forum in Mayo

South Australian Senator, Penny Wong and the Shadow Minister for Health and Ageing, Mark Butler hosted an Aged Care Forum during April to address what they see as “8 years of neglect”

Approximately 80 attendees came from all ends of the Mayo area to meet with the politicians and discuss their experiences with the aged care system.

While not all experiences shared were negative, there was a strong agreement that the waiting list for aged care packages are far too long and that the aged care system needs more funding for staffing.

Mark Butler called on the Federal Government to deliver serious improvements in the Federal Budget to be announced in May, alongside restrictions around every-increasing portions of funding going to ‘administrative costs’

Senator Wong highlighted, that “Having these conversations plays an important role in strengthening our community” and that “In order to improve aged care, we have to listen to those who rely on the system to care for them.”

Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide

The Federal Government has announced a Royal Commission to investigate suicides by current and former Defence personnel.

Whilst announcing the Royal Commission, the Prime Minister acknowledged that “... the rate of suicide of Australian Defence Force members and veterans is unacceptably high.”

Minister for Veterans’ Affairs and Defence Personnel, Darren Chester said that “This will provide an opportunity for us all to reset, further increase our understanding of this issue, and unite the Parliament, the ex-service community, and the families who have been affected by suicide.”

The Government has decided that it is likely there will be three Commissioners tasked with chairing the Royal Commission. Public Consultation on the Draft Terms of Reference will also be undertaken and will be led by Minister Chester.

The Royal Commission comes after strong advocacy from the community, led by Julie-Ann Finney who lost her son David to suicide in 2019. Ms Finney said that the announcement was “a long time coming” Ms Finney has previously been joined by Members of the Opposition and Cross-Bench to put pressure on the Government to establish this Royal Commission.

Aldinga Washpool is Waiting!

Aldinga Washpool, the seasonal wetland between Aldinga Scrub and Sellicks Beach, is waiting for many things right now. As always at this time of year, it is anticipating the arrival of winter rains to once again create a shallow lake, springing to life with water bugs. Then the frog symphony can be heard each night, and wading birds from across Australia and the world will take up residence till summer once again dries up the wetlands.

But the Washpool is also waiting to hear from Premier Steven Marshall! In February he promised local conservation groups that he would make a significant announcement by mid-March, in regard to the future protection of the Washpool from subdivision! Currently, SA Water is proposing to sell off four blocks on Justs Rd that are critical to the long-term restoration of the Washpool.

The Washpool knows too well how to wait – it's now 50 years since the South Australian Government promised to reunite Aldinga Scrub Conservation Park and the Washpool. For the last 5 years we've been promised that the different government agencies that own bits of the Washpool will be required to relinquish title for the declaration of a full Conservation Park.

But on the ground there's lots happening, with thousands more local species to be planted over the coming months, and the re-introduction of the Yellowish Sedge Skipper butterfly to pollinate the *gahnia filum* thatching grass. So, watch this space!

Coming to South Australia in 1996, she worked several jobs before eventually landing positions in Christie Downs Primary and eventually Aldinga Primary.

She signed off her address in the last school newsletter with: “Life is good, I could not be happier!”

Community Remembers much loved Principal



As school returned at Aldinga Primary for Term 2 for 2021, the school community was feeling the pain of losing Principal Mel Justice.

Ms Justice who had unexpectedly passed away during the school holidays, was farewelled by the community at memorial service on Friday 30th of April.

Aldinga Local Jess Sweet who was on the interviewing panel for the Principal’s position posted on Facebook that: “Mel’s shoes will be difficult to fill I truly mean it. Mel shone out in a sea of candidates.”

Local MP Leon Bignell recalled her love for music and thanked her for her leadership passion and care for the children and families in Aldinga.

Students also shared their messages of how she motivated them, was fair and positive and loved the environment.



Main South Road Public Meeting

About 70 local community members gathered at the Aldinga Library on the 27th of April to discuss the proposed Duplication of Main South Road.

Both Labor and Liberal parties were invited to bring speakers to both talk about their vision and to hear directly from the Community.

The Labor Party was well represented by the Leader Peter Malinauskas, Transport Spokesperson Tom Koutsantonis and local MP Leon Bignell. The Liberals did not send any representatives, despite having the same period of notice as the Labor Party. The Minister for Transport Corey Wingard and Liberal Candidate for Mawson Amy Williams have invited ABRA to meet with them privately.

At the meeting, a range of views were expressed, however a consistent theme was a general disappointment that the Liberal party did not send anyone, and that the proposal was flawed.

Issues raised about the plan ranged from the acquisition of properties, the lack of cross-community connection through access on adjoining roads, the inappropriateness of roundabouts and concerns about safety and trucks around the Northern half of the project. Many also raised disappointment around the lack of funding for transport in the South compared to the Northern suburbs.

While the Labor party did not make specific commitments relating to the process, Peter Malinauskas did highlight that the party was currently working on policy development in the lead-up to the next election and that Leon has been a strong advocate for the community about this project for many years.

It was urged that if the public do not support either of the proposed options or that they are disappointed that the money allocated with this project is now being shared with another road, instead of properly funding both then readers should head to the Department's page (see link at the bottom of this page) and tell the Government that neither option is adequate.

ABRA continues to support the work of the Main South Road Action Group (MSRAG) who is calling on the public to reject both proposed options and call for the full duplication to Sellicks Beach with safe intersection upgrades and interchanges.

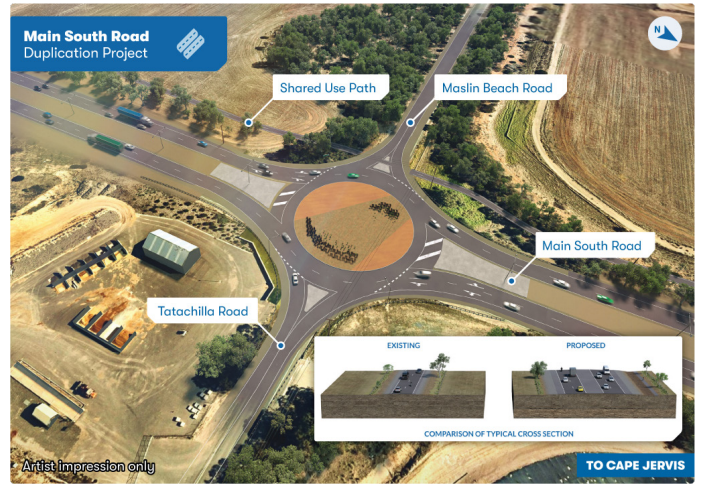


Photo: Two Lane Roundabout proposed for Tatachilla, Maslin Beach and Main South Road intersection

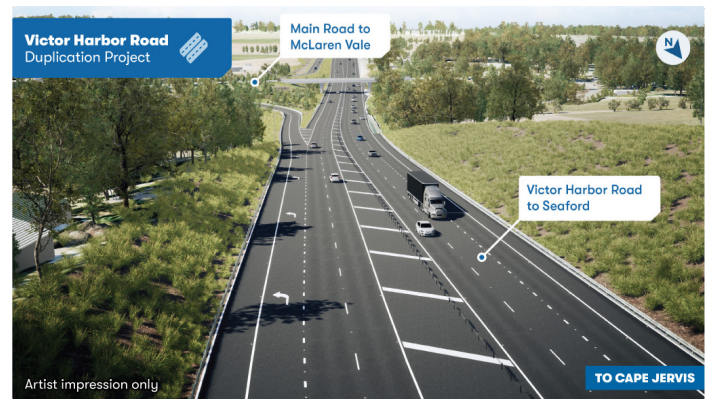


Photo: Duplicated Victor Harbor road, which is being included as part of both scenarios

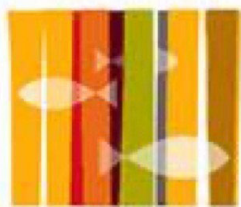

Man arrested over drugs and weapon at Seaford

A Sellicks Beach man will face court after he was found in possession of methamphetamine, prescription drugs and a baton.

Just before 8pm, on Thursday 29 April, police were called to the Seaford Shopping Centre on Commercial Road, after a man was seen carrying an extendible baton.

A short time later police patrols located the man in the car-park. On speaking with him he was found in possession of the baton which is classified as a prohibited weapon. He was also found to have a quantity of methamphetamine, a prescription drug and two firecrackers.

The 20-year-old man was arrested and charged with trafficking a controlled drug, possession of a prohibited weapon and unlawful possession of a prescription drug. The man was also issued with a 'on the spot fine' for possession of the fireworks.

A 19-year-old man from Aldinga Beach who was in company with the arrested man was reported possessing a prohibited weapon after he was also found in possession of torch which was also a taser. Both men will appear in the Christies Beach Magistrates Court at a later date.

Serious crash McLaren Vale
